PRINCESS PAGEANT JUDGE SELECTION

Pageant judges are selected by a confidential committee based on experience, knowledge and impartiality. Judges are screened for conflicts of interest prior to the pageant event and are prohibited from interaction with contestants until the preliminary personal interview portion of the pageant, held before the evening event.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Contestants are scored based on the following exhibitions:

- **Preliminary personal interviews with judges** (interviews completed during the day on Friday, Sept. 17; 15 possible points)
- Traditional Chickasaw dress and introductions (10 possible points)
- Talent/presentation (10 possible points)
- Response to random question during pageant (10 possible points)
- **Tiebreaker** (if needed, written response from contestant answering provided question; 5 possible points)
